## Financial Details:

Graduate Assistantship (GA) and Associate Instructorship (AI) awards come with tuition remission and a stipend. When combined, the total value of a full GA or AI award for the 2013-2014 academic year will range from approximately \$27,000 to as much as \$45,000 per year, depending on the nature of the position awarded.

## Application and Admission:

All graduate students accepted to the Jacobs School of Music are considered for scholarship or fellowship opportunities. Some Graduate Assistantships and Associate Instructorships require a separate application. Details about applying to the Jacobs School vary depending on the program of interest. Approximately 80% of our current graduate students receive some form of merit-based financial aid, ranging from partial awards to full tuition. No separate application is necessary, as all applicants to the Jacobs School of Music are considered for these awards.
